Operational Definitions

Active Cases	An active COVID-19 case is an individual that has been confirmed as testing positive for COVID-19. An active case also includes an individual who is still in isolation or still contagious, and someone who is epidemiologically linked to a confirmed case and showing symptoms.
Close Contact	Someone who was within 6 feet of a COVID-19 infected person for at least 15 minutes starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.
Isolation	The purpose of isolation is to keep individuals infected with a contagious disease (i.e. COVID-19) away from healthy people to prevent the sickness from spreading. Isolation serves the same purpose as quarantine, with the main difference being that isolation is reserved for those who are already sick (think ill = isolation).
Quarantine	The purpose of quarantine is to keep individuals who were exposed to sickness (i.e. COVID-19), but are not showing symptoms, away from others so they do not unknowingly infect anybody. Governments use quarantines to stop the spread of contagious diseases. Individuals who have had "Close Contact" (see definition above) with someone who has COVID should quarantine.
Person/Blended Model	Students attend school 4-5 days each week with additional safety precautions in place. A key differentiator between the in-person model and the hybrid model is that students spend most of their instructional hours in the school building. <i>The model at any given time is determined by conditions related to the pandemic.</i>
Hybrid Model	This plan allows for a reduced number of students in the buildings while providing a combination of in-person and remote learning. A key differentiator between the hybrid model and the in-person model is that student instructional hours are balanced between the school building and remote learning. <i>The model at any given time is determined by conditions related to the pandemic.</i>
Remote Learning Model	Students attend school through remote learning experiences delivered through a learning management system. <i>The model at any given time is determined by conditions related to the pandemic.</i>
At-Home Model	Fully remote program designed as a temporary response to the COVID-19 pandemic opted into by families through a special enrollment process by trimester regardless of Risk Level. Students enrolled in the At-Home receive instruction from the EDSOLNS staff. <i>The At-Home program remains in operation regardless of Risk Level (See Ohio Public Health Advisory System).</i>
